CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES FROM OCTOBER 23, 2012

The Regular Meeting was called to order by Mayor Strazdas at 7:30 p.m.

At the request of Mayor Strazdas, Pastor Todd Korpi of the Kalamazoo First Assembly of God Church of Portage gave an invocation and Boy Scout Troop 287 led City Council and the audience in the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

The City Clerk called the roll with the following members present: Councilmembers Jim Pearson, Patricia M. Randall, Edward J. Sackley and Terry R. Urban, Mayor Pro Tem Claudette S. Reid and Mayor Peter J. Strazdas. Councilmember Elizabeth A. Campbell was absent with excuse. Also in attendance were City Manager Maurice S. Evans, City Attorney Randy Brown and City Clerk James R. Hudson.

Upon a voice vote, motion carried 6 to 0 with Councilmember Sackley abstaining from vote on the Committee of the Whole Meeting Minutes.

* **APPROVAL OF ACCOUNTS PAYABLE REGISTER OF OCTOBER 23, 2012:** Motion by Pearson, seconded by Reid, to approve the Accounts Payable Register of October 23, 2012. Upon a roll call vote, motion carried 6 to 0.

PUBLIC HEARINGS:

MUELLER COPPER TUBE PRODUCTS COMPANY – PA 198 TAX ABATEMENT: Mayor Strazdas introduced Community Development Director Vicki Georgeau, who explained that this public hearing was for the request to expand Industrial Development District Number 1 for Mueller Copper Tube Products Company. She provided a brief review of the process involved in this request and indicated that it was initially a request for a 12-year tax abatement, but is now a 5-year tax abatement request for both real and personal property before City Council with the understanding that Mueller Copper Tube Products Company could come back for a review and a request for extra years per City Council Policy. She also pointed out that the process was reduced to two steps in order to meet the October 31 deadline set by the State Tax Commission. She explained that the expansion of the District was necessary to accommodate the proposed rail spur on the property.

In response to Mayor Strazdas, Jack Treas, Vice President and General Manager, Mueller Plastic Systems, spoke in support of the application and highly praised the quality of the workforce in Portage as a major reason for relocating to their facility at 6700 Sprinkle Road. Mayor Strazdas opened the public hearing to discussion and comment from the public. There being no discussion, motion by Urban, seconded by Reid, to close the public hearing. Upon a voice vote, motion carried 6 to 0.

Motion by Sackley, seconded by Urban, to adopt Resolution No. 2-12 expanding Industrial Development District No.1. Upon a roll call vote, motion carried 6 to 0.

MUELLER COPPER TUBE PRODUCTS COMPANY – PA 198 TAX ABATEMENT:

At the request of Mayor Strazdas, Community Development Director Vicki Georgeau explained the tax abatement process and provided review of the application materials presented in the City Council Agenda Packet. She explained that normal City Council Policy is a tax abatement for six (6) years for real property and three (3) years for personal property; however, since the property at 6700 Sprinkle Road has been vacant since January, 2011, she indicated that Mueller Copper Tube Products Company is eligible for a 5-year tax abatement request for both real and personal property with the option of coming back after three years for an evaluation of a request for an extra three years. Discussion followed. Mayor Strazdas opened the public hearing to discussion and comment from the public. There being no discussion, motion by Sackley, seconded by Reid, to close the public hearing. Upon a voice vote, motion carried 6 to 0.

SUBJECT: Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) Contract for Centre Avenue/Portage Road Traffic Signal Interconnection Project

ACTION RECOMMENDED: That City Council:

- a. approve Contract 12-5523 between the Michigan Department of Transportation and the City of Portage for funding of the Centre Avenue/Portage Road Traffic Signal Interconnection Project; and,
- b. adopt a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to sign Contract 12-5523 and any other documents related to this project on behalf of the city.

The City Administration recently received a proposed contract between the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) and the City of Portage concerning improvements to the city traffic signalization system. Improvements include the expansion of the city traffic operation center and installing an interconnected traffic signal system on Portage Road (Fairfield Road to Bacon Avenue) and on Centre Avenue (Angling Road to Portage Road). The system will provide video detection, and incorporate real-time traffic monitoring into the city traffic operation center through a fiber optic network established with the project. The upgraded system will improve traffic flow and progression along these developing corridors.

The cost of all planned improvements related to this project is estimated at \$833,500 with a maximum federal funding contribution of \$728,521. The city share of the project cost is estimated at \$104,979, which is budgeted as part of the 2012-13 Capital Improvement Program. It has been MDOT's policy over the years to submit cost sharing agreements to local municipalities once the project has been advertised for construction bids. MDOT cannot award a construction contract without a signed cost sharing agreement from the local municipality. The city share of expenses is calculated based on estimated construction costs developed by the consulting engineer and refined by MDOT staff engineers.

Once the contract is awarded by MDOT, construction of this project will commence in the spring of 2013. Subsequent to contract award by MDOT, the project is turned over to the city for construction inspection and administration.

It is recommended that City Council approve Contract 12-5523 between MDOT and the City of Portage for funding of the Centre Avenue/Portage Road Traffic Signal Interconnection Project and to adopt a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to sign Contract 12-5523 and all other documents related to this project on behalf of the city.

SUBJECT: 2013 Recreation and Open Space Plan Update

The Department of Parks, Recreation and Public Services has initiated an update of the 2008 Recreation and Open Space Plan, which is an element of the Comprehensive Plan. As required by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) for park acquisition and development grants consideration, the Plan and is updated every five years.

The following summarizes the substantive changes since the 2008 Plan update:

1. The Eliason Nature Reserve has been added to the inventory of park facilities.
2. Portage South Central Greenway has been identified, which includes the West Lake Nature Preserve, South Westnedge Park, Bishops Bog, Schrier Park and Eliason Nature Reserve.
3. Content of the Plan has been revised to fulfill MDNR Grants requirements.
4. The Plan has been updated to reflect changes in the city organization and the revised vision and mission for the Parks & Recreation divisions.
5. Recreation Inventory has been revised to be consistent with MDNR Grant guidelines.
6. Planning Process, Public Input and Public Information has been added to fulfill MDNR requirements.
7. Short-term Objectives, Action Plan Priority List and Financial Program has been updated to reflect the 2012-2013 Capital Improvement Program

During the October 10, 2012 meeting, the Parks Board reviewed the draft 2013 Recreation and Open Space Plan Update and recommended approval of the Plan update to the Planning Commission. The Planning Commission reviewed the draft document during the October 18, 2012 meeting and voted unanimously to forward the 2013 Recreation and Open Space Plan Update to City Council with several recommended revisions, which have been incorporated into the Plan.

Pursuant to the Michigan Planning Enabling Act (Act 33 of 2008, as amended), once the Planning Commission has completed review of the draft document, it is submitted to the legislative body for review and comment. The City Council must then approve the distribution of the 2013 Recreation and Open Space Plan Update to adjacent communities and the county, which are provided up to 42 days to review the plan and submit any comments. At the conclusion of the review and comment period, the Planning Commission will conduct a public hearing and review any comments regarding the 2013 Recreation and Open Space Plan Update. After considering comments and any changes, the Planning Commission will provide a recommendation to City Council. The MDNR requires that the recreation plan element of the Comprehensive Plan be adopted by the local governing body.

pursuant to the Michigan Planning Enabling Act and stated this was the first step whereby the Planning Commission reviews the draft document and then submits it to City Council for review, comment and distribution to adjacent communities and the county. After distribution and a 42 day review comment period, Mr. Forth indicated the Planning Commission will then conduct a public hearing and forward a recommendation to City Council who will formally adopt the Plan Update. Mr. Forth then summarized the major changes to the Plan Update and then introduced Ms. Jill Hess, Deputy Director of Recreation & Senior Citizen Services.

Ms. Hess, Mr. Forth and the Commission next discussed various aspects of the 2013 Recreation and Open Space Plan Update including the annual parks/facilities assessment process, the use of the Plan Update for Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) grant applications, reduction in the surrey and canoe rental program, funding sources for recreational programs and services and the upcoming public hearing for the Eliason Nature Reserve Master Plan. Commissioner Dargitz suggested including a map of sensitive areas in the 2013 Open Space and Recreation Plan Update document, similar to the map contained in the 2008 Comprehensive Plan (Map 3 – Natural Features). Commissioner Stoffer asked where “Allan Creek” was in the city? Mr. Forth and Ms. Hess indicated they would research but believe the reference may be to Davis Creek. Commissioner Reiff stated there are many terms in the Plan document that are not commonly known and suggested inclusion of definitions to assist the intended user of the document. Commissioner Artley stated the City of Portage does an excellent job managing the park/trails system which enhances the quality of life for all residents. Commissioner Reiff indicated the data contained in Table 1 – Average Monthly Climatological Data does not correlate with the text at the top of Page II-2. Ms. Hess stated she would review and make adjustments where necessary. Commissioner Reiff also provided a list of typographical errors he identified while reviewing the plan document. Commissioner Welch inquired as to why there was no reference to gun clubs/shooting ranges in Table 6 – Major Facilities (within 30 minutes travel time). Ms. Hess indicated she would review and discuss with Parks Department staff and make changes, where appropriate.

After additional discussion, a motion was made by Commissioner Bosch, seconded by Commissioner Reiff, to forward the 2013 Recreation and Open Space Plan Update to City Council with consideration of the following: 1) Inclusion of a natural features/sensitive areas map similar to the map included in the 2008 Comprehensive Plan; 2) Inclusion of definitions within the text portion of the Water Resources section, and 3) Inclusion of other clarifications/corrections identified by the Commission during the review and discussion of the draft document (see previous paragraph). The motion was unanimously approved.

SUBJECT: 2013 Recreation and Open Space Plan Update

The Department of Parks, Recreation and Public Services has initiated an update of the 2008 Recreation and Open Space Plan. The Recreation and Open Space Plan is a component of the Comprehensive Plan and is updated every five years and amended, as necessary, to provide a valuable planning tool and fulfill Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) requirements for park acquisition and development grants. Enclosed is a draft copy of the 2013 Recreation and Open Space Plan.

The following summarizes the substantive changes since the 2008 Plan update:

1. The Eliason Nature Reserve has been added to the inventory of park facilities.
2. The combination of West Lake Nature Preserve, South Westnedge Park, Bishops Bog, Schrier Park and Eliason Nature Reserve has been identified as the Portage South Central Greenway. These adjoining recreational areas encompass more than 450 acres and five miles of trails.
3. Content of the Plan has been revised to fulfill MDNR Grants requirements.
4. Section III, Administrative Structure, has been updated to reflect changes in the city organization and the revised vision and mission for the Parks & Recreation divisions.
5. Section IV, Recreation Inventory has been revised to be consistent with MDNR Grant guidelines. Parks have been reclassified, descriptions updated and information on accessibility and MDNR Grant inventory added.
6. Section V, Planning Process, Public Input and Public Information has been added to fulfill MDNR requirements.
7. Section VIII, Short-term Objectives and Section IX, Action Plan Priority List and Financial Program has been updated to reflect the 2012-2013 Capital Improvement Program

During the October 10, 2012 meeting, the Parks Board reviewed the draft 2013 Recreation and Open Space Plan Update and has recommended approval of the Plan update to the Planning Commission. Attached is a communication from Parks Board Vice-Chairperson, Susan Williams.

As required by the Michigan Planning Enabling Act (Act 33 of 2008, as amended), once the Planning Commission has completed review of the draft document, it is submitted to the legislative body for review and comment. The City Council must then approve the distribution of the 2013 Recreation and Open Space Plan Update to adjacent communities and the county, which are provided up to 42 days to review the plan and submit any comments. At the conclusion of the review and comment period, the Planning Commission will conduct a public hearing and review any comments regarding the 2013 Recreation and Open Space Plan Update. After considering comments and any changes, the Planning Commission will provide a recommendation to City Council. The MDNR requires that the recreation plan element of the Comprehensive Plan be adopted by the local governing body.

The Planning Commission is advised to review and discuss the 2013 Recreation and Open Space Plan Update during the October 18, 2012 meeting. Changes, if any, will be incorporated into the document before the Plan is forwarded to City Council.

SUBJECT: Workers' Compensation Excess Insurance and Third Party Administration Contracts

ACTION RECOMMENDED: That City Council:

- a. award a one-year contract renewal to Safety National Casualty Corporation for workers' compensation excess insurance coverage for an annual fee of \$50,116 plus payroll adjustments;
 - b. approve a one-year contract renewal with Eagle Claims Management for workers' compensation third party administration for an annual fee of \$8,686;
- and authorize the City Manager to execute all documents related to these contract renewals on behalf of the city.

In October 1993, City Council approved a recommendation by the City Administration to convert workers' compensation coverage from fully insured to self-insured effective December 1, 1993. There are two primary elements associated with a self-insured workers' compensation program: 1) excess insurance and 2) third party administration. Excess insurance provides coverage in the event a catastrophic occurrence exceeds \$500,000 (increased by the carrier from \$400,000 for this renewal), the total of all claims exceed \$990,224 in a policy period or a liability claim is made against the city due to a work-related injury or illness which exceeds \$500,000. The third party administrator is retained to manage workers' compensation claims, process associated medical and indemnity payments, provide claims data and manage litigated claims as directed by the city.

Contracts with the city excess insurance carrier, Safety National Casualty Corporation (SNCC), and the city third party administrator, Eagle Claims Management, will expire on November 30, 2012. Quotes were solicited from excess insurance carriers for one-year contracts. The lowest quote meeting the coverage requirements was submitted by the city's current carrier, SNCC, for an annual fee of \$50,116 plus payroll adjustments. Acceptance of the proposed contract renewal with SNCC is recommended for the period of December 1, 2012 - November 30, 2013.

With regard to third party administration, it is recommended that the city renew the contract with Eagle Claims Management for a one-year period (December 1, 2012 - November 30, 2013) at an annual cost of \$8,686. Total payment to Eagle Claims Management, including commissions from the excess carrier, remains the same from the past two years. Eagle Claims Management has provided excellent service to the city over the past seventeen years and, as directed by the city, has taken an aggressive approach to case management. It is critical that the city retain consistency in regard to workers' compensation claim administration, therefore, bids from other third party administrators were not solicited. City Council approval of one-year contract with Eagle Claims Management is also recommended.

SUBJECT: Tax Reverted Property at 10323 Archwood

ACTION RECOMMENDED: That City Council reject the transfer of foreclosed property at 10323 Archwood Drive and authorize the City Manager to advise the Kalamazoo County Treasurer of this action by November 30, 2012.

As explained in the attached communication from the Treasury Supervisor, the Kalamazoo County Treasurer has provided notice (attached) that a foreclosed property located in the City of Portage that went unsold at auction will be transferred to the city unless a written rejection is received by November 30, 2012. The property is located at 10323 Archwood Drive and is currently vacant. The property was previously improved with a two-story dwelling and attached garage, which was demolished by the city subsequent to severe damage by water from a fire and failure by the property owner and/or Mortgager to repair the dwelling.

Whether the city chooses to retain the property or reject the property transfer, the city is liable for payment of delinquent taxes that have been paid by the county to the city over the years. Delinquent taxes owing to Kalamazoo County total approximately \$12,000. The City Assessor estimates the property value at \$33,000, which has been adjusted to reflect the cost to remove the foundation if a new dwelling was constructed. Based upon a staff review, no need for city ownership of the parcel has been defined, other than for the potential recouping of taxes to be paid to Kalamazoo County.

Information from the Kalamazoo County Treasurer indicates that should the city reject the transfer of the property at 10323 Archwood Drive, the property will be placed in the Kalamazoo County Land Bank. Reportedly, the Kalamazoo County Land Bank intends to utilize the vacant lot for a community garden, based upon a request from neighborhood residents.

With no identified city need for the property located at 10323 Archwood Drive, it is advised that transfer of the property from Kalamazoo County be rejected and the Kalamazoo County Treasurer notified of this action by November 30, 2012.

SUBJECT: 10323 Archwood Street

On Thursday, October 18, 2012 I attended the Kalamazoo County Treasurers Association Quarterly meeting. At that meeting, Kalamazoo County Treasurer Mary Balkema handed out letters to those jurisdictions which had properties that had not been sold in the land auction that was held recently by Kalamazoo County.

One of those properties, 10323 Archwood Street, is located in the City of Portage. Attached is the letter to the City of Portage regarding this property. At this time, as the property did not sell in the auction, the property reverts back to the original jurisdiction, which would be the City of Portage. In the near future, the city will need to reimburse the Tax Revolving Fund at the county for the delinquent taxes that have been paid back to the city over the years for this property. This will not change if the city retains the property or rejects it back to the county. I talked to Greg and Peggy at the county treasurer's office yesterday regarding the amount that the city would be billed for this, and they are unable to give me a figure at this time.

At the meeting Mary stated that if the City does not want this property, the property needs to be rejected back to the County. She also stated that she would prefer that the City reject the property back to the County as at that time the property would be put into the land bank. This is a property that the home burned down, the property is located in Ed Sackley's neighborhood, and the County Treasurer's office was contacted by people in that neighborhood with an interest in turning this property into a community garden.

Please let me know if I can provide any additional information on this.

As the foreclosing governmental unit (FGU) for the county of Kalamazoo, it is my duty to collect delinquent taxes. When collection efforts are unsuccessful, the parcels are forfeited to the treasurer and ultimately foreclosed upon.

We held a minimum bid auction on July 31, 2012. The remaining parcels were sold at a “no minimum bid” auction on September 24, 2012. There were several parcels that did not sell.

Properties that are unsold after the second round of auctions are to be deeded to the local unit unless they **reject** them pursuant to MCL 211.78m(6):

(6) On or before December 1 immediately succeeding the date of the sale under subsection (5), a list of all property not previously sold by the foreclosing governmental unit under this section shall be transferred to the clerk of the city, village, or township in which the property is located. The city, village, or township may object in writing to the transfer of 1 or more parcels of property set forth on that list. On or before December 30 immediately succeeding the date of the sale under subsection (5), all property not previously sold by the foreclosing governmental unit under this section shall be transferred to the city, village, or township in which the property is located, except those parcels of property to which the city, village, or township has objected. Property located in both a village and a township may be transferred under this subsection only to a village. The city, village, or township may make the property available under the urban homestead act, 1999 PA 127, MCL 125.2701 to 125.2709, or for any other lawful purpose.

Parcels in your jurisdiction did not sell: 90-5820-007-O (10323 Archwood)

Unless I receive notification before November 30, 2012, the property will be deeded to City of Portage by December 31, 2012.

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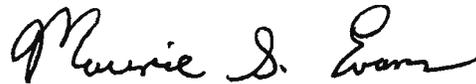
