

Nature Scavenger Hunt

Try to find each of the items listed below. If the item has the word “collect” next to it, you may take the item. If the item has the words “describe and note location” next to it, write where you found the item, but do not remove it!

When you have collected all your items and notes, attach the items on a sheet of paper with tape or glue. At the bottom of the paper note the other non-collected items and where you found them.



1. A blade of grass longer than your thumb (collect)
2. An acorn cap (collect)
3. A leaf on the ground (collect) *Identify the type of leaf and write next to the leaf on your paper*
4. A pine cone (collect)
5. A few pine needles (collect)
6. A twig longer than your thumb but shorter than your foot (collect)
7. Moss on the side of a building, fence, rock or other item (describe and note location)
9. Spider web (describe and note location)
10. Ant hill (describe and note location)
11. Plants or insects in a sidewalk crack (describe and note location)
12. Bird (describe, note location—can you identify what type of bird?)
13. Amphibian or reptile (describe and note location)
14. Mouse, squirrel or other small animal (describe and note location)
15. Larger mammal (describe and note location)
16. Two different kinds of seeds (collect—can you identify them?)
17. Animal track (make a drawing)
18. Flower (collect, identify)
19. Small rock (collect)
20. Bird call/song (describe what it sounds like)
